Over the past nine months, 13,122 children were supported through Variety's grants, programs, events and experiences - children living with disability, experiencing disadvantage, or illness, who were given the chance to participate, learn, and thrive. Behind each number is a story of inclusion, opportunity, and hope, made possible through the generosity of our donors, sponsors, and volunteers.

This year, we strengthened our foundations, refreshed our strategic direction, and expanded our reach - standing beside thousands of children and families when they needed it most. Through initiatives such as the expanded Motor Mouth Camp program and increased support for regional schools and community groups, Variety WA continues to evolve to meet the growing needs of children and families across Western Australia.

I extend my heartfelt thanks to outgoing Board members Roy Mellon, Jenny Rachmat and Glenn Cornish for their service and commitment, and sincerely thank our continuing Board members for their ongoing dedication, expertise and vision as they help guide Variety WA into its next chapter.

To everyone who has contributed - thank you for standing beside us and sharing in our mission. Your ongoing support reminds us that when communities come together, there's no limit to what we can achieve for WA kids.

Please note this report covers a nine-month period from October 2024 to June 2025, reflecting our transition to align with the Australian Tax Financial year.

Message from the Chief Executive Officer

2025 has been a year of renewal, collaboration, and meaningful impact for Variety WA.

In the last nine months, Variety has opened doors for more than 13,000 children across Western Australia, creating access to equipment, experiences and opportunities that would otherwise be out of reach.

In response to the ongoing cost-of-living and social pressures faced by WA families, we refined how we deliver support to ensure help reaches children more efficiently and effectively.

The Variety EduKids Program removes barriers to learning for children experiencing disadvantage. In 2025, over 6000 children in 135 schools in every region of the state were directly supported and given the resources they need to thrive.

This year we continued to evolve our programs to meet the changing needs of children and families. The Variety Motor Mouth Camp provides intensive communication support for children who use Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices, along with vital connection for their families. This program will expand in 2026 with two camps, doubling its reach and enabling even more children to find their voice. This was made possible with the support of Telethon and with generous support from the Morning Sunshine Foundation.

Through our partnership with Fly2Health, we piloted an innovative regional health initiative, granting 75 free allied-health assessments for children aged 0–6 in the Goldfields, Midwest and Wheatbelt. Early results have been incredibly encouraging, showing the life-changing difference that early intervention can make for children's development and wellbeing.

Our Variety Sunshine Packs Program continued to provide care and comfort to children entering crisis accommodation or out-of-home care, with 1,863 packs distributed. Each pack serves as a small reminder to a child in distress that they are seen, valued and cared for.

We were also proud to deliver a successful calendar of community and fundraising events. Our motoring events - including the Bash, 4WD Adventure and Creative Car Cruise - continue to drive awareness and generate significant revenue, ensuring we can reach even more children across WA. Behind the scenes, we're strengthening our presence across the state as part of our strategic





plan to increase our ability to support children and families across Regional WA. By the end of the year, we will have a new office in Broome, working directly with families across the Kimberley and significantly improving our support in the region.

In addition, the rollout of our new national brand guidelines and style guide, together with the upcoming Variety WA website, will enhance how we connect with our many audiences and showcase the impact of our work across the state.

This year, we received more than \$3.7 million in requests for assistance, underscoring the ongoing and urgent need for our support. As demand continues to rise, our focus remains on expanding reach, deepening partnerships and finding new ways to ensure every child in WA has the opportunity to thrive.

To our small but dedicated team, our volunteers, donors and partners - thank you. Together, we're building brighter futures for WA kids, one act of kindness at a time.

Variety - the Children's Charity began in 1928, when a group of entertainers in Pittsburgh, USA, found and cared for an abandoned baby girl in a theatre.

Their compassion inspired a worldwide movement dedicated to supporting children who are sick, experiencing disadvantage, or living with disability.

Nearly a century later, Variety has grown into a global network of 38 Tents and Associations across 11 countries, empowering millions of children through life-changing grants, programs, scholarships, and experiences.

Here in Western Australia, Variety WA has been part of this global network for more than 40 years, delivering vital support to local children and families. From essential medical equipment and mobility aids to educational resources and inclusive programs, Variety WA helps ensure that every child - no matter their background or ability - has the opportunity to thrive.

Together with our community of supporters, Variety WA continues to make a lasting impact across the state - filling the gaps when other support falls short and helping children to reach their full potential.

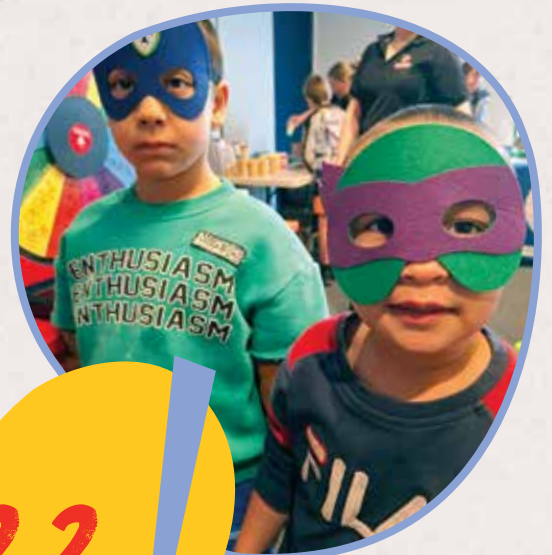

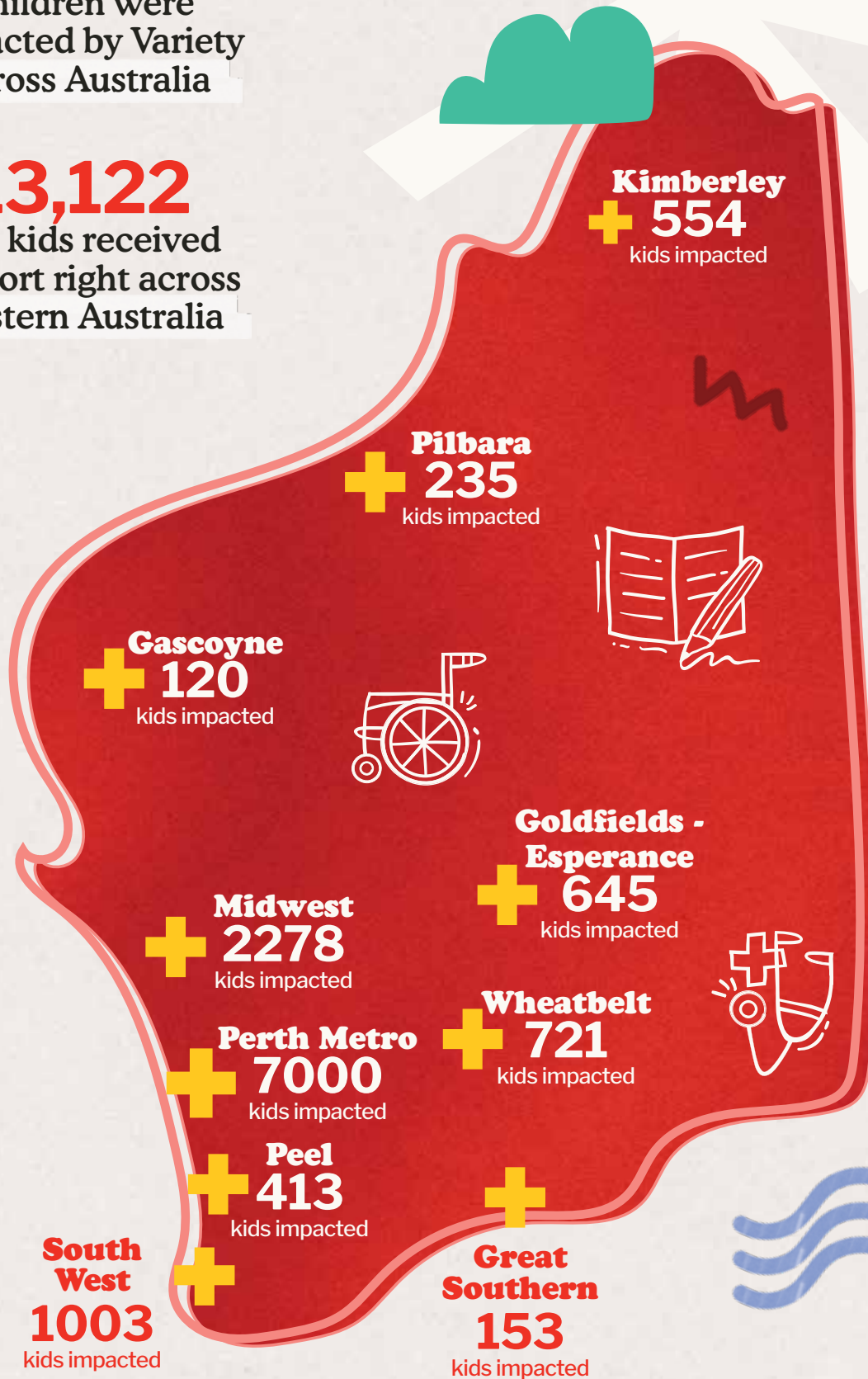

Through our Care, Freedom, and Future Programs, we deliver a full circle of support - ensuring no child is left behind, no matter where they are on their journey. **Together, we help WA kids dream beyond boundaries.**



CARE

2,448 children supported

Variety's Care Program provides immediate and essential support for children and families facing significant challenges. These initiatives deliver essential care, comfort, and connection - supporting WA kids when they need it most.

Over the last year, we have provided grants of essential medical equipment and items to support wellbeing to children living with sickness, disability or experiencing disadvantage.

A total of **2,448 children** were assisted through the **Variety Care Program**.

As part of this program, we delivered **1863 Sunshine Packs** and supported **75 regional children** with our **Fly2Health Initiative**.



FREEDOM

375 children supported

Variety's Freedom Program create independence and inclusion through mobility and accessibility. This program gives children the ability to move, explore, and participate fully in everyday life by providing grants that support physical access, connection, and confidence.

In 2024/25, **375 children were supported** with vital equipment and resources that promote accessibility and inclusion.

Through this support, Variety continues to help WA kids gain freedom in movement, participation, and everyday living.



FUTURE

10,299 children supported

Variety's Future Programs open pathways to education, communication, and personal growth - helping children build skills, confidence, and a sense of possibility.

Over the last year, we have provided grants and programs which enabled **10,299 children to be assisted** through this Program.

VARIETY PROGRAMS

VARIETY EDUKIDS

The Variety EduKids Program gives WA children the positive start to school they deserve by providing essential back-to-school items such as stationery, uniforms, and learning materials. With almost one in five children in Western Australia living below the poverty line, education is key to breaking the cycle of disadvantage. EduKids helps ensure every student has the resources they need to learn with confidence - fostering self-esteem, a sense of belonging, and stronger engagement both in the classroom and at home.

The 135 schools we supported this year made incredible use of their grants through thoughtful and creative planning, resulting in 6163 children being given access to the equipment they need to succeed.

YANCHEP LAGOON PRIMARY SCHOOL

A Variety WA EduKids grant enabled Yanchep Lagoon Primary School to expand its Breakfast Club, providing new toasters, blenders, crockery, cutlery, and social games. The upgraded equipment has transformed mornings into moments of connection - creating a welcoming space where students can relax, chat, and start the day with confidence, nourished and ready to learn.

“When students first start at a new school, they often feel invisible. Breakfast Club gives them a place to belong - where there are no cliques, just kids sitting together, talking and helping each other. Now, they walk through the gates each morning knowing they’ll see friendly faces - and that changes everything.”

Teachers have also noticed a remarkable shift. Students who once arrived late or withdrawn now turn up early, smiling and engaging with others. The Breakfast Club has become much more than a meal - it’s a calm, caring space that sets the tone for the day and gives every child a fairer start, regardless of what’s happening at home.

DJIDI DJIDI ABORIGINAL SCHOOL

A VarietyWA EduKids grant provided new school uniforms, including cosy winter jackets and Year 6 leavers' shirts, helping to ease financial strain on families and ensuring students felt included and proud.

"This grant has allowed us to substantially reduce costs for families in need, ensuring all students had access to proper uniforms. It's also given our Year 6 graduates a leavers' shirt to remember their days at Djidi Djidi - something most other schools take for granted."

JOONDALUP EDUCATION SUPPORT CENTRE

Through the combined support of our Motoring Events School Grant and EduKids funding, Joondalup Education Support Centre received a new 3D printer and junior playground equipment - enhancing both classroom learning and outdoor play.

"The 3D printer has been amazing - it's helping us bring students' ideas and designs to life while supporting hands-on learning across the curriculum,"

BINDOON PRIMARY SCHOOL

With support from Variety WA, Bindoon Primary School established a new Nature Play Area - a much-loved space where students can play, connect and grow together.

Designed with natural elements including logs, seating, a swing and a cubby, the space invites imaginative play, collaboration and exploration, and offers a calm and welcoming environment that supports wellbeing and positive social interaction.

The Nature Play Area has been particularly valuable for children who benefit from quieter, sensory-rich spaces, enabling every student - regardless of ability or background - to engage meaningfully in play and feel a strong sense of belonging.

This new space reflects the school's values of inclusivity, connection and care for the environment, while nurturing the wellbeing of every child.

USELESS LOOP PRIMARY SCHOOL

Turning distance into connection.

When the Variety 4WD Adventure rolled into Useless Loop - a tiny, closed mining town 2.5 hours by unsealed road from Denham - it brought more than colour and noise to the 22-student primary school. It brought connection.

For a community where deliveries can be delayed for weeks when the roads close, the visit and grant meant a great deal. Rather than buying routine supplies, the school used its Variety grant to create experiences families would remember - craft resources for Father's Day, handmade Christmas Jenga sets for each household, and an excursion to Shark Bay including a marine park visit, live music performance and lunch for every family.

"It's not just a school activity, it's a community day. We're supporting local businesses too - 50 meals at the pub, 50 tickets to the Ocean Park. It's a win all round."

To say thanks, the school will host a community breakfast and donate proceeds back to Variety.

For the children of Useless Loop, the day the 4WDs arrived wasn't just excitement on the oval - it was a lesson in generosity, adventure and what it means to give back.



VARIETY MOTOR MOUTH CAMP

Sixteen children and their families attended this year's Variety Motor Mouth Camp, supported by thirty-nine allied health professionals and volunteers.

We received a record number of applications for both camp and volunteer places - clear evidence of the growing demand for this unique and inclusive program.

The Motor Mouth Camp remains the only program of its kind in Western Australia, changing lives through communication, connection, and community. Created to fill a critical gap in access to training and support for families using augmentative and alternative communication (AAC) devices, the camp helps build a thriving AAC community that shares knowledge, encouragement, and a collective voice for children with complex communication needs.

Proudly supported by Telethon, the camp continues to expand thanks to the generous contribution of the Morning Sunshine Foundation, whose support will double the capacity of the program in WA through the addition of a second annual camp, and establish a new camp in Queensland for the very first time.

Many children communicate differently, and for some, barriers make verbal speech difficult or impossible. Instead, they may rely on subtle signs such as blinks, nods, or sounds, alongside their AAC devices, to help express themselves. The Motor Mouth Camp combines fun with intensive therapy and training for school-aged children, their parents, siblings, and carers, opening up a whole new world of communication and confidence.

Led by a Committee of skilled speech pathologists and occupational therapists and powered by passionate volunteers, the camp provides opportunities for children to practise their communication skills through workshops and play-based activities. Families participate in group sessions that connect them with others on similar journeys, while siblings and parents enjoy activities designed especially for them.

ZACH'S STORY

Six-year-old Zach lives with cerebral palsy and uses an AAC device to communicate and connect with those around him.

When Zach and his family attended **Variety WA's Motor Mouth Camp**, something powerful happened - his AAC device became a tool for laughter, learning, and genuine connection. Together, they discovered new confidence and ways to communicate that strengthened how they connect as a family.

VARIETY HEART SCHOLARSHIPS

Variety Heart Scholarships celebrate the remarkable abilities of Western Australian children living with disability, illness, or experiencing disadvantage - empowering them to pursue their dreams in sport, the arts, and academics.

Made possible through the generous support of the Grahame Mapp Family Foundation, the program provides funding for essential items such as equipment, tuition, uniforms, and competition or travel fees - helping talented young people unlock their full potential.

In 2025, 70 outstanding children were awarded a Variety Heart Scholarship. - a 45% increase from last year. From young dancers and athletes to aspiring musicians and scholars, each recipient represents courage, passion, and determination.

Looking ahead to 2026, applicants will be able to apply for up to \$4,000 in funding to support their chosen field, continuing Variety's proud legacy of nurturing WA's next generation of achievers.

SCHOLARSHIP SPOTLIGHT : JAXON

When 13-year-old Jaxon laces up his skates, he's not just chasing medals - he's chasing his dream.

After claiming multiple State Titles at the WA Championships, Jaxon is now preparing to represent Western Australia at the National Championships in Melbourne in January 2026 - the result of years of early mornings, dedication, and determination.

Thanks to a Variety Heart Scholarship, Jaxon and his family can focus on his training and performance rather than the growing costs of competitive sport.

Inline speed skating has taught him discipline, resilience, and focus - qualities that will stay with him long after he crosses the finish line.



SCHOLARSHIP SPOTLIGHT: LILLI

Six-year-old Lilli had recently been diagnosed with **Type 1 Diabetes and ADHD**, and her family was adjusting to new routines and medical needs.

Through Variety, Lilli received a **Heart Scholarship** to pursue her passion for dance - helping to cover costumes, exam fees, and her first cheer competition in Perth. "She's grown so much in confidence and skill," says her mum, Sarah. "Without Variety's support, these experiences wouldn't have been possible."

An invitation to the **Variety Midwest Kids Christmas Party** brought even more joy. "The joy on Lilli's face, her siblings', and all the other children's was absolutely priceless," says Sarah.

VARIETY PROGRAMS

VARIETY SUNSHINE PACKS

The collaboration between Operation Sunshine and Variety WA has allowed **1,863 children to receive a gift of hope from the Variety Sunshine Pack initiative, an increase of 11% from 2024.**

Sunshine Packs provide thoughtfully prepared backpacks to children entering out-of-home care or crisis accommodation - often at one of the most vulnerable and uncertain times in their lives.

Each pack is filled with essential items such as clothing, toiletries, books, and comfort objects like a soft toy or blanket - small gestures that deliver an enormous impact. For many children, it's the first time in days or weeks that they've received something just for them - a powerful reminder that they are seen, cared for, and not alone.

Designed to restore dignity, comfort, and a sense of belonging, the packs help children navigate sudden change with a little more security and hope.

FLY2HEALTH

Delivered in partnership with Variety WA, the Fly2Health program helped bridge the gap in access to vital developmental support for children living in remote and rural communities.

Across Western Australia, 75 children received free allied health assessments – including 20 in the Goldfields/Esperance, 47 in the Mid-West, and 8 in the Wheatbelt.

By flying qualified speech pathologists, occupational therapists, and other allied health professionals directly into regional towns, the program ensured that children received early assessments and interventions that might otherwise be out of reach.

Early access to these services can make a life-changing difference - improving communication, learning, and long-term developmental outcomes for children who would otherwise face years of delay. Through this partnership, Variety WA helped ensure that distance is never a barrier to opportunity.

READY STEADY GOLF

Building Confidence, One Swing at a Time

Proudly supported by Variety WA and the WA Golf Foundation, Ready Steady Golf is an inclusive program helping children of all abilities build confidence, coordination, and friendships through the game of golf.

When Yvette heard about the program, she knew it could be a great opportunity for her son Ethan, who is blind, to try something new. With the guidance of coach Mark and the all-abilities team, Ethan quickly found his swing - and his confidence.

"As a parent of a child with a disability, having access to programs like this is such a blessing," says Yvette.

VARIETY CHOIR

The Variety Choir is an inclusive community for young people who share a love of singing, music, and performance. Using music as a foundation, the Choir helps members build self-confidence, develop friendships, and foster a strong sense of belonging.

This year, 25 children joined the chorus - a 25% increase in membership. With every rehearsal and performance, the Choir continues to grow in both size and spirit, bringing joy, connection, and creativity to its members and audiences alike.

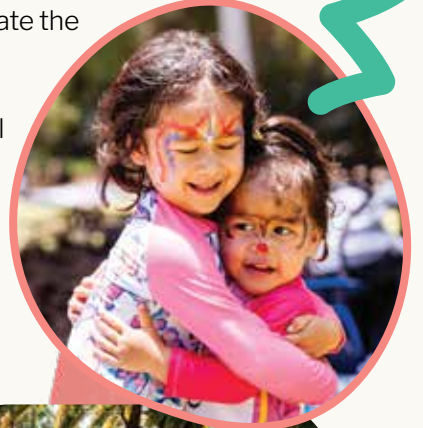

DOUBLE THE MAGIC

In a powerful display of community generosity, Variety WA launched the Double the Magic matched giving campaign, inspired by an anonymous \$100,000 donation.

The campaign invited supporters to double their impact—every dollar donated was matched to help provide essential equipment and support for WA kids.

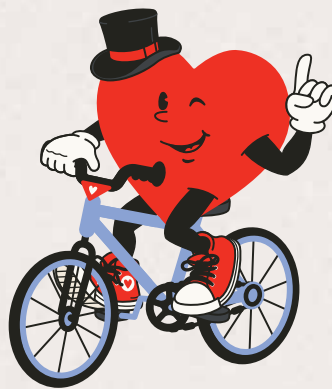
At the heart of the campaign was the story of Riley, who received a specialised mobility pram through a Variety grant, giving her the freedom and independence to explore the world around her. Her story was joined by others like Aviana, who received funding for an electric wheelchair and vehicle modifications, and Goldie, who now enjoys greater mobility thanks to new hydrotherapy equipment and an all-terrain buggy.

To bring the campaign to life, Variety WA partnered with 6PR and Dôme Café for a live **Match Giving Day** broadcast from Dôme Café at Deep Water Point. 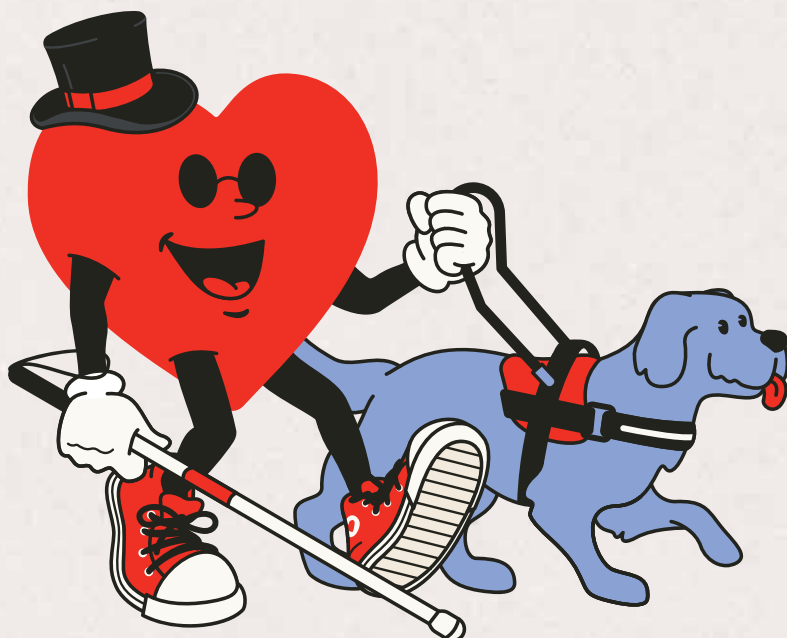
